Ocean Beach Welcomes our Community Back!

The Shire of Denmark is thrilled to announce that, after many months of hard work, Ocean Beach and the Boat Ramp are open once again – just in time for summer.

Shire President Aaron Wiggins said the reopening is a celebration, and these upgrades make it even more welcoming for the whole community.

"Ocean Beach is part of Denmark's heart and soul, and it's great to see this area transformed into a more accessible, and more inviting destination for everyone, restoring the feel and access the area had before the storm erosion," Cr Wiggins said.

Upon arrival, visitors will find smooth concrete paths that lead down to the fresh, new-look amenities structure where beachgoers can now enjoy heated showers within private cubicles, as well as the more spacious modern facility.

ontinuing towards the shore is the renovated Denmark Surf Life Saving Clubhouse, featuring refurbished facilities that will support the vital work of volunteers who keep our coastline safe.

Following the path further, the precinct opens up to the landscaped areas and lush, reticulated turf, providing the perfect place to relax and soak up the sunshine. The new seawall surrounding the grassed areas, in addition to securing the new topography of the area, provides more seating areas. Visitors will also now enjoy easier access to the shore, thanks to new stairs linking the upper and lower levels.

Parking at the boat ramp access remains prohibited to ensure continued public safety, and a dedicated disabled parking bay ensures that everyone can enjoy the beauty of Ocean Beach

A brand-new kiosk will also open early in the new year, following the completion of the tendering process, adding even more convenience for beachgoers.

Cr Wiggins said the redevelopment could not have been completed without the dedicated hard work of everyone involved in this massive project.

"We are incredibly grateful for the tireless work of our staff at the Shire of Denmark, the contractors and tradespeople and our Surf Life Saving Club volunteers," Cr Wiggins said.

"I also thank our community for the patience and cooperation throughout this redevelopment, and I can't wait to see everyone enjoying this special place once again."

The Ocean Beach Redevelopment was proudly funded by the Department of Transport, Department of Creative Industries, Tourism & Sport, Latterywest, Great Southern Development Com-Surf Life Saving Club and the Shire of Denmark.

Water supply in a bushfire

This information could save your life



While leaving high-risk bushfires is the safest option, if you plan to stay and defend your home, you must have an INDEPENDENT water supply and pumping capability. This typically requires water tanks of at least 20,000 litres, pump and generator.

This is required as mains water supply and pressure cannot be guaranteed during a bushfire due to the risk of power cuts, fire damage and extreme demand.

Use the Department of Fire and Emergency Services resources to develop your personal bushfire plan: mybushfreplan.wa.gov.au You can also download the My Bushfire Plan app via the App Store or Google Play to access your bushfire plan anytime - even without an internet connection.

To support bushfire plans, if you have groundwater bore access to surface water, you can take and store emergency water without it counting against your annual entitlement. For more information on this, and for the location of emergency bushfire water supplies in dryland agricultural areas, visit the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation website.

Drinking water

We recommend you keep a supply of drinking water on hand throughout summer in case your water supply is interrupted.

Assistance for customers affected by bushfire

After a bushfire, we can assist you with issues such as damaged water meters and payment difficulties. If you have been affected by bushfire please call us on 13 13 85.

A message for fire fighters



What to do in an emergency

Before you hook into the water supply system, call us on 13 13 75 (24 hours).

If we know where you're headed, we may be able to help maintain supply or provide an alternative location that has better pressure.

Reminder to the community

Please help us spread the word that you cannot rely on mains water during a bushfire due to the risk of power cuts, fire damage and extreme demand.

Hydrant location

If you are unsure where the closest hydrants are located, please contact DFES or our Operations Centre on 13 13 75, who will provide you with the exact locations.

Broken hydrants

Any issues with hydrants should be reported to DFES to ensure repairs are made.

Testing

Please contact us before testing hydrants in your area as it may cause nearby properties to experience discoloured water.

Before you hook into the water supply call us 24 hours on **13 13 75**
