COMMUNITY NOTICE

Securing the Future of the Denmark River Arts Market

The Denmark River Arts Market is a much-loved local tradition — a place where our community comes together, local makers and vendors can showcase their work, and visitors are welcomed to Denmark over the holiday period. It adds real vibrancy to town and helps draw in the tourist crowds that **support our local economy**.

To ensure the market can continue into the future, we need to make sure it's **financially sustainable**. Like many community events, the cost of delivering a public market has increased — particularly the overheads required to meet safe practices and procedures in line with State law. These requirements are essential to run a well-managed event that is safe, compliant, and enjoyable for everyone.

For this reason, the River Arts Markets Team and the Denmark Community Resource Centre are trialling a new approach in 2026: a **\$5 entry fee per adult**, with free entry for children under 18.

This isn't "just an entry fee"

It's a **small contribution** that helps make the whole day possible. For \$5, visitors will enjoy local stalls, creative displays, local produce, live music, kids' entertainment, workshops, roving acts and so much more- all for the **cost of a coffee**.

Individual sponsorship and external funding that have been explored and trailed in the past unfortunately aren't viable option moving forward.

This decision hasn't been made lightly, but we can't see another way forward that keeps the market sustainable while meeting the legal requirements of hosting a public event responsibly.

Cyber safety isn't just one person's responsibility — it's a team sport. There are easy ways to start the conversation with your team and have everyone thinking about protecting your small business online.

2. Fake Invoices

Business email compromise (BEC) fraud is a scam to trick you out of money or goods, usually by sending fake invoices that redirect payments to hackers.



3. Business Burglary

Online banking fraud allows cyber criminals to access your bank accounts and transfer your hard-earned cash.





City urges caution when purchasing online pod and kit homes

The City of Albany is urging residents to exercise caution when purchasing small, prefabricated homes online, following an increase in dwellings being delivered locally that do not comply with the National Construction Code.

The City supports and encourages innovative and affordable housing solutions that support the safety of residents, are structurally sound, fit for purpose and compliant with the National Construction Code.

The National Construction Code exists to protect residents by setting out the minimum standard for how buildings are designed and constructed for safety, accessibility, sustainability and durability.

Whilst many online prefabricated dwellings have the appeal of a low upfront cost, modern aesthetics and ease of construction, the City is sending a message to residents to be vigilant about compliance.

City of Albany Chief Executive Officer Andrew Sharpe said the City is seeing residents purchase structures that they expect will comply with the National Construction Code, but in many cases, they do not meet the required standards.

"We're seeing residents purchase these structures expecting they can be used as work-from-home offices, art studios, granny flats or additional rooms for children," Mr Sharpe said.

"However, many of these products are not compliant and cannot be approved for habitation, leaving some residents disappointed, frustrated and out of pocket.

"Residents are encouraged to seek reputable Australian manufacturers producing fully compliant prefabricated dwellings that offer safe, certified, and ready-to-use solutions for a variety of residential and ancillary purposes".

If a dwelling is found to be non-compliant, the owner may be required to undertake significant upgrades which can include certification by a structural engineer, compliant roof and wall cladding, 7-star energy efficiency compliance, and potentially bushfire attack level readiness.

Plumbing, electrical systems, glazing, concrete, structural steel and timber components must all meet Australian Standards, along with an appropriate termite management system.

The City strongly encourage residents to research suppliers carefully and request proof of National Construction Code and Australian Standards compliance before purchasing.

Safe Tradies & DIY – reduce the risk

Fire risks from welding, grinding & outdoor hot works

- Sparks from welding, grinding, or cutting can ignite dry grass, leaf litter, or nearby materials within seconds.
- Avoid undertaking hot works on days with High Fire Danger Ratings or above.
- Always clear the area of flammable materials before starting work.
- Keep firefighting equipment close by. A hose, extinguisher or water source can stop a small spark becoming a fire.
- Stay at least 30 minutes after finishing to check for hidden smouldering spots.
- If the weather becomes hot, windy, or dry, postpone your work. Conditions can change rapidly.

DFES permits & safety guidelines

- Some hot works require a permit depending on the location, time of year and local fire conditions.
- Check DFES and local government guidelines before starting any hot work outdoors.
- Ensure everyone on site understands the conditions of the permit, including supervision, spark control, and suppression equipment.
- On a Total Fire Ban Day, it is illegal to light an open-air fire or conduct any activity that could start a fire. For a full list of prohibited activities, [visit the DFES website](#).

Safe use of power tools & lithium-ion batteries.

Lithium-ion batteries are increasingly linked to house and shed fires.

- Always use the charger supplied with the device.
- Charge batteries on hard, non-flammable surfaces, away from sleeping areas.
- Replace damaged, swollen, or overheating batteries immediately.
- Don't leave tools or batteries in hot vehicles or direct sunlight.
- Store batteries away from flammable liquids and materials.

Let's take action this month!

- Stay aware: Check Fire Danger Ratings daily through [Emergency WA](#).
- Use tools safely: Choose cooler times of day for outdoor work and avoid high-risk weather.
- [Refresh your plan](#): Does your household know what to do if a fire starts while you're working outside?
- Check in with your community: Support tradies, hobbyists, and neighbours by sharing safe-work messages.
- Seek support: Your local CPA or the [Community Preparedness Directorate](#) can assist with resources or engagement ideas.

Every safe decision you make while working outdoors helps protect your home, your neighbours, and your community.
