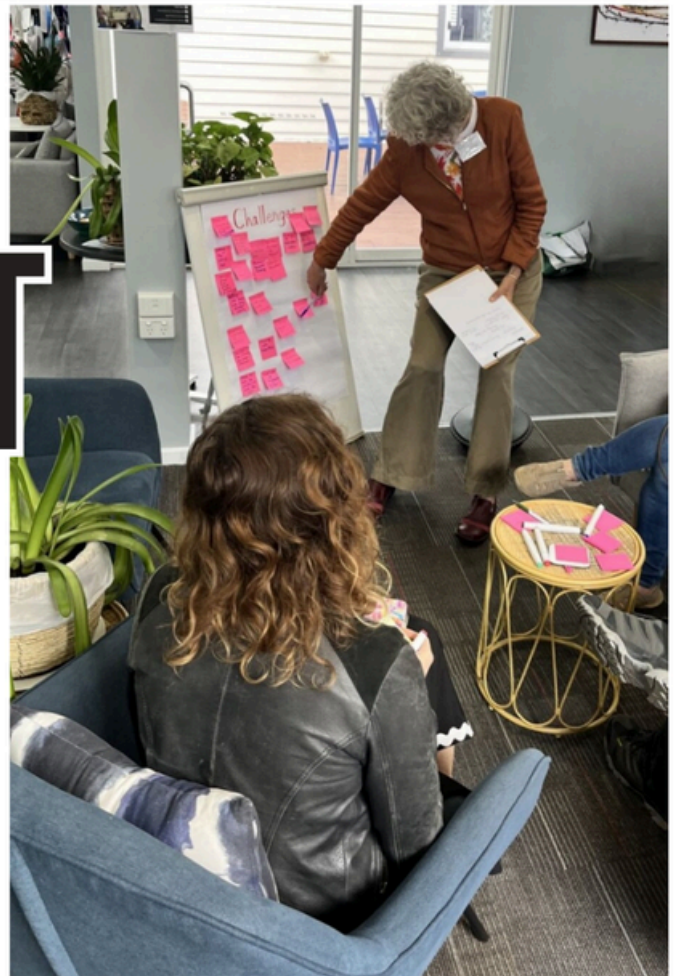

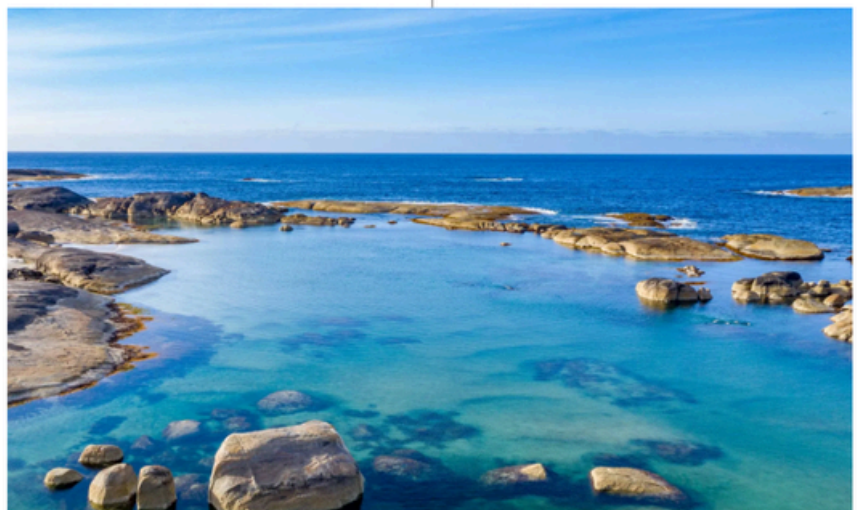

# COMMUNITY CONNECTOR WORKSHOP

## BRINGS LOCAL GROUPS TOGETHER

As part of Neighbourhood Week, local community groups and non-profit organisations recently came together at the Denmark Community Resource Centre for a collaborative and informative Community Connector Workshop focused on **strengthening community connections**.

The workshop created a welcoming space for local groups to discuss shared challenges, **identify resources that could be shared, and explore ways to better support the community together**.

A strong focus throughout the discussions was the importance of welcoming newcomers to town and helping connect people into community life through volunteering, social groups and local activities. Organisations shared how important those first connections can be in helping people feel supported, included and part of the community.

Many organisations also highlighted the **growing need for volunteers** and the value of working together to promote opportunities, reduce duplication and share information more effectively.

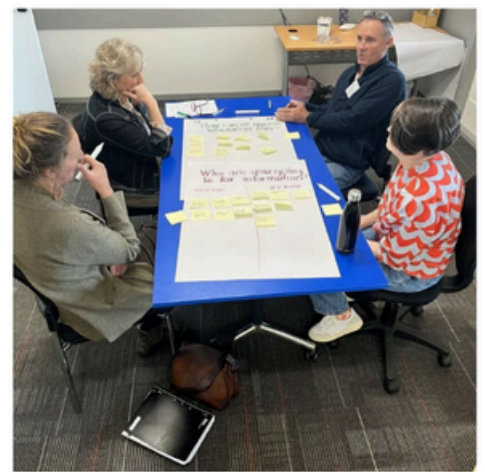
There was a strong sense of collaboration in the room, with groups recognising that by supporting each other and working together, **we can build a more connected, resilient and welcoming Denmark community for everyone**.

Participants explored current challenges facing community groups, barriers to supporting locals, and opportunities to reduce duplication by sharing spaces, equipment, skills, volunteers and communication channels.

Another key discussion centred around how information flows through the community — identifying who people naturally turn to for support and how local information networks can be strengthened to better connect people to services and support when needed.

As a result of the workshop, the Denmark Community Resource Centre has begun **developing a local resource and connection information sheet** to help community members more easily access services, groups and opportunities.

**Will Yeoman**  
For nearly three decades, Will Yeoman has combined arts and travel journalism, music criticism and curatorial work with leadership roles in the writing sector. Will worked for many years at The West Australian as literary editor, arts and travel writer and West Weekend staff writer, and continues to contribute to the paper. In parallel he has built an international reputation as a music critic, writing for Gramophone, Limelight and other classical music outlets in Australia and the UK. As a festival director, Will has served as artistic director or curator for Perth Festival Writers Week, York Festival, York Regional Writers Weekend and the New Norcia Writers Festival, often foregrounding connections between literature, music and place. In 2023 he was appointed CEO of Writing WA, Western Australia's peak body for writing and publishing, a role he held for about two years while remaining active as a freelance writer and critic. ## Electronic identification for sheep and goats

Electronic identification (eID) for sheep and goats is required in Western Australia under the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Identification and Movement of Stock and Apiaries) Regulations 2013*. From 1 July 2026, all sheep and goats must be fitted with National Livestock Identification System (NLIS)-accredited electronic tags, and all livestock movements must be recorded on the NLIS database.

### Follow these 4 steps to meet your requirements

#### Registration and account set up



##### 1. Register as an owner of livestock or, check your registration status

##### 2. Set up a myMLA account and link your accounts

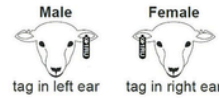
#### Identification requirements

##### 3. Order your NLIS-accredited eID devices and identify your livestock

All sheep and goats born from 1 January 2025 must be tagged with a year-of-birth (YOB) colour eID device by six months of age or before moving off your property, whichever comes first. Stock not born on property and without an existing eID device must be identified with a pink post-breeder eID. Stock born on your property, before 1 January 2025 can be identified with a yellow or year-of-birth colour eID.

- Devices are species-specific. Ensure you specify the type of livestock when ordering.
- Ensure you have access to the correct type of tag applicator.
- Your eIDs will display the NLIS ID on the outside. You can include other limited details like your stock brand or farm name, depending on the eIDs you choose to use.

#### Tag positioning



Pink eIDs are applied to the same ear as the existing visual tag.

#### Tagging tips

- Before tagging any livestock, check for existing eIDs – only one functional eID per animal.
- Do not remove any visual tags when applying an eID device.
- Remove non-NLIS accredited electronic management tags before sale to avoid scanning confusion.

#### Stock movements

##### 4. A movement document must accompany all consignments of livestock

- LPA accredited producers can access the free eNVD web-based system, mobile app or purchase NVD waybills via their LPA account.
- The receiver is responsible for recording stock movements onto their NLIS account within 48 hours of the movement.
- Livestock agents or third parties can complete transfers on your behalf. You should request the 'upload ID' for your records.

#### Examples of scanning and transfer responsibilities

Situation	Responsibility
Producer buys NLIS accredited eIDs	Tag manufacturer uploads eID device RFIDs to producer's NLIS account
Buying or selling at a saleyard or on-farm public auction	Saleyard operator or livestock agent scans and uploads
Buying or selling privately (e.g. a neighbour)	Purchaser scans and uploads
Buying at an online auction	Purchaser scans and uploads
Moving stock for agistment	Producer scans and uploads
Moving to and from an agricultural show/event	Agricultural show/event organiser scans and uploads
Selling to an abattoir or feedlot	Abattoir or feedlot operator scans and uploads

## Maintaining Smoke Alarms



#### Once a month

Press the test button on your smoke alarm for up to 10 seconds until you hear the alarm sound. If the alarm does not sound, try putting in a different battery or replace the smoke alarm.

#### Every year

##### Clean your smoke alarms

Use a vacuum cleaner with a soft brush to gently clean dust and dirt from your smoke alarm.

Cleaning your smoke alarm helps stop false alarms and makes sure smoke can reach the sensor.

#### Replace the battery every year, if needed

All smoke alarms have batteries, even smoke alarms connected to mains power.

Replace the battery in smoke alarms that use a 9-volt alkaline battery. Smoke alarms with a non-removable lithium battery will have a warning label saying not to replace the battery.

If you're unsure about the battery type, ask the smoke alarm manufacturer.

#### Every 10 years

##### Replace all smoke alarms every 10 years

Smoke alarms do not last forever. Their sensitivity decreases over time, making them unreliable. Replace them every 10 years.

## How do I change a battery?

### 1. Identify what type of alarm you have

All smoke alarms come with batteries. Even those connected to the mains power have a back-up battery for power outages.

The battery could be a non-removable lithium battery that lasts the entire 10-year life of the alarm. This means you don't need to replace the battery every year.

Alternatively, the battery could be a replaceable 9-volt alkaline battery.

Smoke alarms with a 10-year non-removable lithium battery will have a warning label stating the battery is not to be replaced.

### 2. Turn off the mains power (for mains-powered alarms)

Turn off the mains power at your meter box (fuse box) before changing the battery in a mains-powered alarm. The green light on the alarm will go out and the red light will flash.

### 3. Remove the smoke alarm from its base

Smoke alarms are attached to the ceiling with a base. To remove the alarm, you might need to press a button, twist and pull, or slide it off. Check the manufacturer's instructions for your model.

### 4. Replace the old battery

If you can take out the batteries, change them once a year.

### 5. Turn on the mains power (for mains-powered alarms)

Turn on the mains power at your meter box (fuse box). The green light on the alarm will come back on.

### 6. Test the smoke alarm

Test the smoke alarm again, by pressing the test button until you hear the alarm sound. If you do not hear the alarm sound, try putting in a different battery or replace the smoke alarm.



Test your alarms once a month. Clean your smoke alarms every year. Replace the battery every year, if needed. Replace all smoke alarms every 10 years.

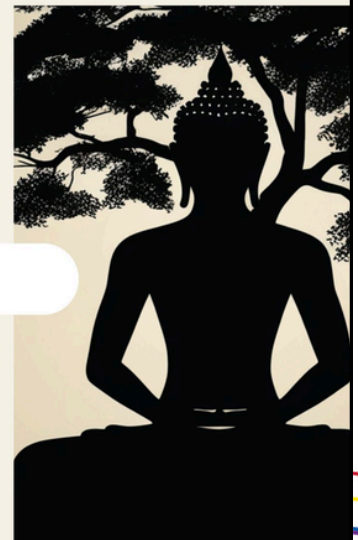
